From the Desk of Pastor Taylor:

To the beloved community of & around St. Matt's,

I pray the (somewhat fickle) warming of the weather is warming your hearts the way it's warming mine. I pray you're finding rest in this season when our rhythms are often shifting, if not always slowing.

Growing up in a busy family when extra time (or funds) were hard to come by, we didn't go on very many vacations in my childhood. Because of that, the trips we did take stand out in my memory as very special, and one commonality I remember from those childhood family trips was worshiping in new places. Always a church nerd, I of course loved exploring vacation, funeral, or wedding destinations through church buildings we would find on our ways. But the worship experience I remember most clearly? It's not that famous cathedral in New Orleans or even the tinv Lutheran church in Seattle that doubled as a homeless shelter- it was the mini worship service we had in our hotel room, just the 6 of us, somewhere in Orlando in the middle of the Disney trip we'd won in a raffle. We fumbled through some songs, prayers, and readings together before a full day of amusement park-ing, intent on marking this part of our weekly rhythm even if it didn't make sense to travel to a church offsite that day.

Our hope for members of this community of all ages is that you find a faith that sticks- a relationship with God that sustains and moves you throughout your everyday life and that grows and changes with you throughout the many seasons of your life. This is as lofty a goal as it is a simple one. We trust that the promises made in baptism carry us throughout our lifetime.

My personal experience and lots of recent research shows that the **faith that sticks** is usually faith that gets taken home. Whether you live alone, with a partner, or with multiple generations...

...taking faith home can enliven your relationships as you further integrate your spirituality into the other aspects of who you are. What does taking faith home look like? It can be as simple as starting a habit of praying regularly- something you may already do whenever you share a meal with someone. It could look like making a point to ask questions of your loved ones like, "What did you learn about in Faith Connections this week?" or, "Where did you see God today?" It could look like sharing your favorite Bible stories or learning new ones together. There are physical changes to your space that can facilitate **faith that sticks**, too.

Newest Home Decor Trend: Sticky Faith Chic

- Think about creating a designated **sacred space** somewhere in your home that physically signals to you (and especially to little ones) to notice and appreciate God's presence. There's no right or wrong way to do this, and use your family's collective imagination to put it together. See how many of the 5 senses you can engage in your home altar with candles, elements from creation, treasured trinkets, artwork, etc.
- Prayerfully consider a scripture story or verse that is especially meaningful or encouraging to
 you and yours, and incorporate a visual reminder of it into your decor. Maybe there's some
 artwork that depicts a scene from that story you love, or one of those classic Bible verse signs
 you can find at a local crafting store. Maybe something as small as a sticky note with some key
 reminder words is more your speed. Again, a visual scripture reminder could be a great
 opportunity for collaborative creativity- the sky's the limit!
- Pick out a prayer bowl that can hold slips of paper with names or situations in need of prayer
 written on them. Create a habit in your household of gathering regularly to pick out a few at a
 time, talk or think about who or what you're praying for, and pray together. See if any prayer
 requests can be taken out of the bowl and add in anything new that's not yet there, and return
 again to the bowl together the next week/month/day.

These are just a few ideas to try out that could help ground your faith life Monday through Saturday, especially in the summertime. Taking faith home is, in a nutshell, living out our baptismal promises. And none of our baptismal promises- not the ones made by adults, parents, sponsors, or confirmands- are made alone. The church you were baptized in and the church universal enters into the covenant of baptism with you, and at the end of the day, it is God's promise to us that seals the deal. We at St. Matthew are responsible for equipping you to live out your baptismal promises on your own, with your families, and out in the world. We hope that weekly worship (available online if you're traveling on weekends this summer!) can renew and enliven your faith through scripture and sacrament. We seek to provide meaningful faith formation experiences for a variety of ages in a variety of contexts that can be "starts" rather than "ends" to your God-encounters. All said, we seek to live into a faith community here at St. Matthew that is something like a laboratory for God-talk, practicing faith-based conversations with your siblings in Christ in a context facilitated by spiritual leaders that you can continue throughout your week in other contexts.

We know taking faith home isn't easy, and you never do it alone. We are here to help you find a **faith that sticks**.
