From the Desk of Pastor Taylor:

St. Matthew members, family, and friends,

As the leaves start to change here in the mid-atlantic, I am reminded of a lasting image of God I encountered in Autumn of 2019. This particular time, it wasn't God revealed in a passage of scripture or theology, it was God revealed in creation. I love when that happens.

I was driving from Gettysburg, PA to Austin, TX, "in between" two places I found myself calling home during a very "in between" season of my life. I was already in ministry but not yet ordained to it. I was already engaged to Andrew but not yet married to him. I was already an adult but not yet entirely grown up. (By the way, if anyone has figured out how to grow up, please do let me know.) On this journey "in between," the foliage of the Blue Ridge foothills took my breath away.

I grew up in a place that no one visits for the autumn views, so almost any view of trees changing colors is enough to make me giddy. This view especially struck me as I noticed with a new appreciation the evergreen trees that served as the backdrop for all the changing leaves that were taking the spotlight. The days were getting shorter for all of the trees. Some of them changed. Some of them stayed the same. All of them were beautiful reflections of God's beautiful imagination. All of them stayed by each other, passing time together.

At the time, I was planning my wedding while one of my good friends from college was planning her mother's funeral after a devastating bout of cancer. I was grieving with her, upset at how unfair it all seemed. This extraordinary sight of an ordinary and predictable pattern of flora was, for me, like God jumping out in front of my car in the middle of a long road trip. These trees- like me and my friend- were standing by each other at such different seasons of their lives as the same time ticked by for all of them.

WORSHIP ASSISTANT TRAINING

Liturgy means “the work of the people,” and it means so much to our identity at St. Matthew and as Lutherans. Worship always happens because of lots of work of “the people”- including you! You’re invited to consider how the Holy Spirit might be nudging you to share your unique gifts through one of the many ways worship assistants offer their leadership in the church. We are offering training for worship assistants in all kinds of roles. Check out the schedule and pick one (or several) to join. **Trainings occur on Sundays, 9:40-10:15 a.m.**



11/06/22 Ushers - *Ushers help the service run smoothly by directing people to seats and to Communion among other responsibilities.*

11/13/22 Communion Assistants and Communion Preparers - *Communion assistants serve Communion to worshipers alongside the pastor(s). Communion preparers gather and prepare the elements and dishware to be used during Communion.*

12/04/22 Lectors and Livestream Operators - *Lectors read scripture lessons in worship. Livestream operators run the video and slideshow for the livestream of worship each week.*

If you’re not sure whether you’d like to be a worship assistant yet but would like to explore, come to a training workshop and find out if it’s right for you! If you’d like to learn a particular role but have a conflict that day, contact the office and we’ll figure something out. **Ages 11 to 111 are welcome to try out any role.**

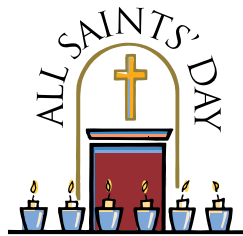
