All are welcome to the Lord's Supper. The meal is served in several ways. Choose what is appropriate for you.





'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."

⁴Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, ⁶and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confess-
