inside, as one of us, from birth to death.








THE HOLY GOSPEL: THE ANGELS BRING GOOD NEWS

⁸In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them,





INVITATION TO COMMUNION

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

All are welcome to the Lord's Supper. The meal is served in several ways. Choose what is appropriate for you.

Individual packets are available for those wishing to remain in their pew. If you are unable to come forward, but would like communion served by the pastor, please let one of the ushers know and the Sacrament will be brought to you at your seat.

Continuous manner – Come forward at the direction of the ushers, take the wafer from the pastor, "The body of Christ, given for you", and eat it. (Gluten-free wafers are available) Then move to the next station and take one of the cups of wine (red) or grape juice (white) "The blood of Christ, shed for you", and drink it.

Children who do not yet receive communion are invited to come forward to receive a blessing.



born to us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.







THE MORAVIAN STAR over our manger has its origin in Germany and symbolizes the star that the magi used to find their way to Bethlehem in order to adore the Christ Child. This symbol is left hanging during the Epiphany season which draws together the themes of the birth of Jesus Christ bringing light into the darkness, the coming of the Magi, and Jesus' first miracle in Cana of Galilee.
