From Pastor Kathy's Perspective:

Dear St. Matthew Friends,

Easter Greetings! As I write this letter, we have Holy Week ahead of us but you will receive this newsletter a day or two into the 50 days of Easter. Because of the resurrection, we celebrate the reality that we are not bound by our past. As the Easter story is told in the gospel of Mark, the ending of the gospel is open ended for us to behold the expanse of a new beginning. This does not mean we ignore our past, indeed we come to see it with a fresh lens. It is the living Jesus who is beckoning us into the future with hope.

We are doing this as a congregation. It is with a spirit of life and hope and new beginnings that we are paying attention to God as we listen to scripture, one another and our neighbors. As we learned this past weekend, we discovering this sweet spot where the needs of our neighbors and the passions and strengths of our congregation meet in a way that the love of Christ shines bright.

The scriptures that our LEAD Team have been considering have helped us identify the many and various ways God transforms the lives of people. From Matthew 14:22-23, we discover the importance of keeping our eyes on Jesus as we take risks. From Samuel 3:1-8 we recognize how we need to listen and keep listening to God's voice who calls us to this new way of life. From Acts 8 we recognize the power of chance meetings and conversation to share the faith to the most unlikely ones. And from Habakkuk 2:2 we realize that our purpose needs to be plain and clear even so that our ministries impact for an ever changing context.

Our facilitators from LEAD, Peggy Hahn and John Auger, have inspired us to wonder together as we clarify our purposes, guiding values and specific goals. I offer these questions to you and encourage you to prayerfully consider how you are called to be connected to the Holy Spirit's work among us. (Continued on page 2)

WHY THE ST. MATTHEW PERSONAL CARE KIT MINISTRY FOR LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF IS SO IMPORTANT

Lutheran World Relief seeks to address two questions: How are immediate needs being addressed and how are long term needs being met.

We can see this very clearly in the way Lutheran World Relief approached the recent earthquake in Turkey.

Devastation was everywhere. People were living in tent and container cities. People are focused solely on how to survive the day. Initially people lived in their cars. Lutheran World Relief provided food and personal care kits because stores were not open and there was no employment. So for the Turkish people at the time of their greatest devastation, their very first moment of hope was a meal and personal care kit items from Lutheran World Relief. But that was only the beginning of help provided by Lutheran World Relief.

From their cars, people moved to tent cities. In addition to the food and basic supplies there was a need for basic Sanitation. Lutheran World Relief employed two methods to assist in getting this need met. The first was direct assistance and the second is working with other organizations that share the values of Lutheran World Relief. In particular they work with a group called Young Life. This group uses earthquake survivors to help in their projects because they have found one of the best ways to heal is to help others.

From the tent cities, family units of at least 4 people are moved into a container city. These are small temporary housing units that must be sustainable for at least 3 years since rebuilding the permanent housing in Turkey is estimated to take at least that long. The container city that Lutheran World Relief assists with currently has 400 units plus a community center for educational assistance, meetings, community meals, laundry and large kitchen facilities. Each container unit has electricity, sanitation and heating. Families there are provided with one hot meal per day. There is free transportation to school and jobs. A container house is well insulated and has windows with screens. There is a bedroom, bathroom and living area with an efficiency kitchen. These units are provided by Lutheran World Relief. Container homes from Lutheran World Relief focus on quality installation and plumbing, with no short cuts.

These are just some of the ways that Lutheran World Relief brings vital supplies to people in need the world over. With their emphasis on providing a real presence, quality products and services as well as genuine empathy and caring, they are truly doing God's work in our very needy world.

Join us on Sunday, May 19 at 9:30-10:20 as we work to prepare 500 Personal Care Kits!

Each Personal Care Kit includes:

- *One new bath-size towel(approx.52"X27"), dark color recommended
- *Two bath-size bars(4-5oz) of soap (must equal 8-9 oz) in its original wrapping
- *One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- *One sturdy, wide-toothed comb
- *One metal nail-clipper

You may drop off items in the designated boxes located in the elevator lobby or the church office. Financial donations may be made to be used to purchase bulk items. \$10 could cover the cost of a kit and assist with shipping costs. Checks should be made payable to *St. Matthew Lutheran Church* with *Care Kits* in the memo line.


