

#### From the Desk of Pastor Alex:

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

I have been reflecting much on how important our ministries with children, youth, and families truly are. When kids are baptized, parents are trusted with certain responsibilities:

- to live with them among God's faithful people,
- to bring them to the Word of God and the Lord's Supper,
- to teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
- to place in their hands the Holy Scriptures,
- to nurture them in faith and prayer so that they may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ in word and deed, care for others and the world God has made, and work for justice and peace.

As the Church, we don't expect parents to do these things on their own. We help provide those opportunities to learn and to grow in faith. Worship, Milestones, Faith Connections, VBS, Day Camp, Music Camp, etc. All of these are opportunities for parents to nurture their kids in the faith with the help of the church.

I wouldn't be here as your pastor without the nurturing of both my parents and my home congregation. With the Confirmation families, I said that I don't remember much about the classes themselves. And yet, without a doubt, Confirmation is what led me to ministry. I had already been highly involved – I was a lector, an acolyte, in the choir, etc. And yet, there, in that classroom, I was able to dive into my faith, ask questions, and start to figure out who Jesus is for me and for all of us. And I loved it. Church was life-giving in a period of time in my life when I experienced bullying amid all of the changes that middle school brings. It was on my Confirmation Sunday that I first heard the call to ministry.

Throughout Faith Connections, our children and youth have the opportunity to learn about Jesus, to explore their faith, and to build relationships with one another and with trusted adults. These pieces of Faith Connections, we hope, extend beyond the moment in the classroom. They are building blocks of a life of faith that brings hope and life and love. They are the building blocks of a life of faith that sustains in the good times and in the struggles.

I developed a faith in a God made known in Jesus that refuses to let me go, who walks through the valleys of the shadow of death and climbs to the highest mountains with me, and who will let nothing come between me and the love we've found in Christ Jesus our Lord.

We know that families have too much to do and too little time to do it. But we truly believe that nurturing a life of faith is one of those things that is worth the time and the energy. The relationships we build with Jesus and with one another are invaluable. What starts here can last a lifetime.





## Generosity Corner

Thanksgiving is just around the corner. This holiday, more than most, is filled with Traditions that are passed down generation to generation, like Aunt Millie's corn pudding or Cousin Julie's pecan pie. 
