A Message from Pastor Kathy:

Dear Friends in Christ,

During our Faith Connections Pastors' Class, we are studying the Book of Luke. I call this Gospel a story for our times. It is fascinating to me the way Luke introduces his narrative about Jesus.

How did he piece this story together? He listened. The eyewitnesses shared the stories of Jesus. Luke calls them servants of the word. In the telling and listening these experiences of Jesus were passed on from one generation to another. This is how the followers of Jesus grew in numbers and spread across the world. It is as simple as this; people are talking and people are listening. You could call it Holy HearSay because what they hear then is what they say for others to hear and say for others to hear.

The stories that we hear from Luke are fascinating, relevant, surprising and get to the heart of what it means to be a Christian. It has to do with the neighbor and God's love. When this doesn't happen, the consequences are revealed. The story is multi-textured with a plot line that twists and turns.

Here's why I am inspired to lead this study and why I think it is essential that we gather around tables with our Bibles open; the complexities and uncertainties in the second half of the first century resonate with us who live in the first half of the 21st century. The structures in Palestine and Syria at that time were created for the minority of the rich, the mighty and the power brokers. What does it mean to be faithful in such times?

I'm writing this message to make the case for more of us to come to know the story as it is written and as it is proclaimed and as it is lived. There are lies swirling about Christianity that hold absolutely no bearing to the Holy Scripture. It's not too late to join our Sunday morning Faith Connections class. You will find us by taking the elevator or steps to the second floor. We begin as close as possible to 9:30. No Bible Study experience necessary. All are welcome......



PERSONAL CARE KITS - AROUND THE WORLD AND HERE TOO

The Women of the ELCA and the Intergenerational Faith Connections will be collecting items to assemble **Personal**Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief. People who must flee their homes quickly due to disasters or safety often don't have time to pack essential items. Personal Care Kits help those in need maintain personal hygiene while living away from their homes. The Kits also contribute to a new start for those who can't return home. Now LWR is expanding to reach our neighbors in need in the United States, as well as world-wide as they have before. That means that kits will now comfort families here in the U.S. and abroad!

Each Personal Care Kit includes:

- *One new bath-size towel(approx.52"X27"), dark color recommended
- *Two bath-size bars(4-5oz) of soap (must equal 8-9 oz.) in its original wrapping
- *One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
- *One sturdy, wide-toothed comb
- *One metal nail-clipper



You may drop off items in the designated boxes located in the elevator lobby or the church office. Monetary donations may be made to be used to purchase bulk items (checks should be made payable to *St. Matthew Lutheran Church* with "Care Kits" in the memo line). \$10 will cover the cost of the items and help with shipping costs. The Women of the ELCA and the Intergenerational Faith Connections are combining their efforts for this event.

- Your participation in this group will change you.


Robin Proctor Culp says, "This class was amazing. I highly recommend it. I was in the first class in January and it truly opened my eyes and heart."
