
us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen.



HOLY GOSPEL: John 2:19-23

¹⁹ Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." ²⁰ The Jews then said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?" ²¹ But he was speaking of the temple of his body. ²² After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

²³ When he was in Jerusalem during the Passover festival, many believed in his name because they saw the signs that he was doing.

Lector: The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.

NARRATIVE READING: 1 Kings 5:1-5, 8:1-13

5 [a] Now King Hiram of Tyre sent his servants to Solomon when he heard that they had anointed him king in place of his father, for Hiram had always been a friend to David. ² Solomon sent word to Hiram, saying, ³ "You know that my father David could not build a house for the name of the LORD his God because of the warfare with which his enemies surrounded him, until he^[b] put them under the soles of his feet. ^[c] ⁴ But now the LORD my God has given me rest on every side; there is neither adversary nor misfortune. ⁵ So I intend to build a house for the name of the LORD my God, as the LORD said to my father David, 'Your son, whom I will set on your throne in your place, shall build the house for my name.'

8 Then Solomon assembled the elders of Israel and all the heads of the tribes, the leaders of the ancestral houses of the Israelites, before King Solomon in Jerusalem, to bring up the ark of the covenant of the LORD out of the city of David, which is Zion. ² All the people of Israel assembled to King Solomon at the festival in the month Ethanim, which is the seventh month. ³ And all the elders of Israel came, and the priests carried the ark. ⁴ So they brought up the ark of the LORD, the tent of meeting, and all the holy vessels that were in the tent; the

priests and the Levites brought them up. ⁵ King Solomon and all the congregation of Israel, who had assembled before him, were with him before the ark, sacrificing so many sheep and oxen that they could not be counted or numbered. ⁶ Then the priests brought the ark of the covenant of the LORD to its place, in the inner sanctuary of the house, the most holy place, underneath the wings of the cherubim. ⁷ For the cherubim spread out their wings over the place of the ark, so that the cherubim made a covering above the ark and its poles. 8 The poles were so long that the ends of the poles were seen from the holy place in front of the inner sanctuary, but they could not be seen from outside; they are there to this day. ⁹ There was nothing in the ark except the two tablets of stone that Moses had placed there at Horeb, where the LORD made a covenant with the Israelites when they came out of the land of Egypt. ¹⁰ And when the priests came out of the holy place, a cloud filled the house of the LORD, ¹¹ so that the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud, for the glory of the LORD filled the house of the LORD.

Hello St. Matt's!

I wanted to take a moment and share my experience volunteering with the Changing Lives Shelter at Hanover Area Council of Churches, and the urgent need for more volunteers and supplies.

Being able to volunteer has been a gift. Not only have I been able to lend a much-needed hand to help the staff with everyday functions of the shelter, but the experience has also allowed me to build connections with the current clients, as well as those in need who are not clients but regular visitors. I truly believe it is important to connect with our community in this way as a reminder that we are all human and sometimes "life happens." It is crucial in those times to ensure our neighbors do not feel isolated and alone when the world already makes them feel as such. As a community, it is our duty to lift them up — to not view them by their circumstances but by who they are, to not hear them when they speak but to listen (there's a difference!), and to simply be a light for them in the dark.

The need for volunteers is dire – the shelter is incredibly short-staffed, typically with one person on each shift doing the work required of three to four people. With the cold weather months right around the corner, this is the time they will need help the most as they will open up a separate side of the building to run a cold weather shelter for our friends outside while the shelter itself is still in operation. That will be two shelters needing staff/volunteers that they currently do not have.

Aside from volunteers, the shelter is also in need of supplies. Here is a list of what they are currently seeking: pillows/pillow cases, twin-sized comforters and sheet sets, hot hands, soup cups, snacks, hot chocolate packs, bottled water, travel-size shampoo and/or conditioner, wash cloths, and bars of soap/body wash.
